# **Celebrating Diversity**

Each year we celebrate the rich diversity that is such a wonderful part of our school community. Last week we celebrated European Day of Languages with activities during PCT time and lunchtime. During the month of October we are celebrating Black History Month. The theme for this year is Time for Change: Actions, not Words. We will mark this through lunchtime 'Show and Tells', a special display and an assembly delivered by our pupils. There will also be follow-up lessons in November which focus on tackling racism. We will be holding our first of two special Cultural Days on Thursday 13th October. This will be an opportunity for students and staff to showcase aspects of their family culture and heritage. ## **Reading Spotlight**

- It is important to encourage your daughter to read a range of texts

### Attendance and Punctuality

Good attendance and punctuality helps pupils make positive progress. The government has brought out new rules which means they can issue fines after 5 days of absence if it is not supported by evidence. 5 days where pupils are late without good reason can also lead to a fine. Harrow council also checks our registers. As a reminder, we are not allowed to authorise holidays during term time. Thank you to those parents who have already returned the attendance and punctuality agreement. We appreciate your ongoing support for this important area.

## **Pupil Voice**

Pupils are chosen to represent their class to form our Pupil Voice Forum and discuss matters important to the pupil body. The recent meeting brought up the following main points:

- Year 7-9 need more help with revision: As a result the Year 11 girls are going to provide information sheets and offer some sessions at lunchtime with them.
- **Toilets:** they would like the toilet facilities improved. We will look to complete a 'make-over' in the near future so will be asking pupil voice for design ideas.
- Canteen and the limit of £5 per day: The school sets a limit of £5 spend each day for pupils. Some pupils have asked for this to be raised. To support family finances we are keeping with this limit as it is sufficient to purchase a meal and some snacks each day. If you want your daughter's limit raised or lowered then please contact the school office.

### **Link Books**

Please remember to check and sign your daughter's link book weekly. Pupils must have them with them every day as this is a really important way of communicating between school and home. For example, If you wish your daughter to leave school during the school day, i.e. for a medical appointment, please write a note in her link book. Your daughter then shows this to her form tutor at registration who will authorise this. This can then be shown to her class teacher granting permission for her to leave. Pupils will not be allowed to leave school unless they have a note from a parent and they must then sign out at student services. Please only call the school about appointments in the case of an emergency.

If a pupil is late this will also be stamped in her link book to allow you to check her punctuality.
