Supporting your Daughter

Organisation

- One of the most important aspects to your daughter's success is how she organises her work and activities. Even though she has now started secondary school your daughter will still need help organising herself.
- A 5 minute check of the bag every evening once homework has been done can save stress in the morning and help ensure that your daughter has everything that she needs. This done regularly builds strong routine and good habit.
- Sleep should also be 'organised' or have a routine. As a family have a time that all gadgets and devises must be off by and a place downstairs where this is all kept. Blue lights, constant social media and alerts that interrupt sleep.
- Research also tells us that teenagers need 10 hours of sleep per night and that when a teenager gets less than 9 hours of sleep on a regular basis their memory function is reduced by as much as 40%.



Supporting your Daughter

Homework

- At the Sacred Heart we use an online platform called Satchel One. Every teacher sets homework on this and both pupils and parents are given passwords in September. This means that both you and your daughter can see at a glance what homework has been set and the due date. This helps with organisation and allows parents to see if their child is struggling to meet deadlines. It has been invaluable during this lockdown period.
- We ask that you also check her link book as we have ask that she also write homework down as well as looking at Satchel One.
- This evening you will have received a 'Parents guide to Homework'; and would encourage you to read this document with your daughter and use it to help organise and schedule tasks.



Relationships and Sex Education

Year 7	Self -image and perceptions of others. Friendships and internet safety.
Year 8	A series of lessons designed to foster an appreciation that sexuality is a gift from God in the context of marriage.
Year 9	Pupils explore basic rules we live by and the importance of love as the ultimate rule guide of life. Year 9s also study gender discrimination and prejudice.
Year 10	The girls study abortion and other ethical issues.
Year 11	Explore lessons on a recipe for healthy relationships.



Relationships and Sex Education

In Year 8 and 9 students take part in 'Drop Down Days'. Topics covered include:

- Year 8: Sexually transmitted infections (STIs), consent & internet safety.
- Year 9: Pressures faced by young people to engage in sexual activity at a relatively early age / teenage pregnancy /contraception.

Students will also have a range of Safety Assemblies.
