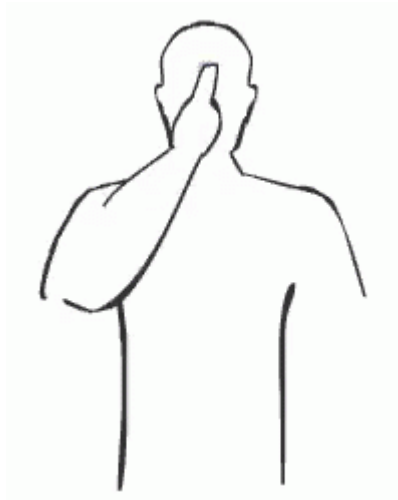
Half Term 2 – Week 1

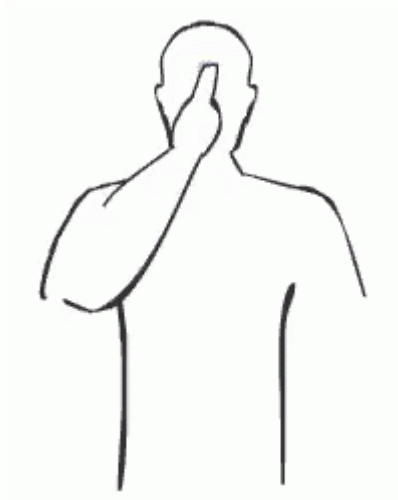

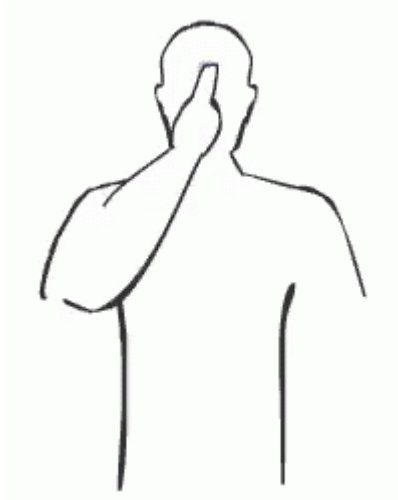

Word Wednesday



'You have heard how it was said to our ancestors, You shall not kill; and if anyone does kill he must answer for it before the court. But I say this to you, anyone who is angry with a brother will answer for it before the court; anyone who calls a brother "Fool" will answer for it before the Sanhedrin; and anyone who calls him "Traitor" will answer for it in hell fire. So then, if you are bringing your offering to the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your offering there before the altar, go and be reconciled with your brother first, and then come back and present your offering.



Word Wednesday



Come to terms with your opponent in good time while you are still on the way to the court with him, or he may hand you over to the judge and the judge to the officer, and you will be thrown into prison.



Word Wednesday



Reader: The Gospel of the Lord

All: Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ





Word Wednesday



The passage is a discussion of the commandment "You shall not murder" and explains that Jesus focuses on the internal heart conditions of anger and contempt that lead to murder. It explains that anger towards a person, insults, and name-calling like "fool" incur divine judgment.

The passage then shifts to a practical instruction: if you are offering a gift at the altar and remember someone has a grievance against you, you must first seek reconciliation with that person before continuing your worship.

What does it mean to say that anger is the seed of violence?

How can I change the way I think or react to difficult situations?

How could I change the way I respond to situations that cause anger?

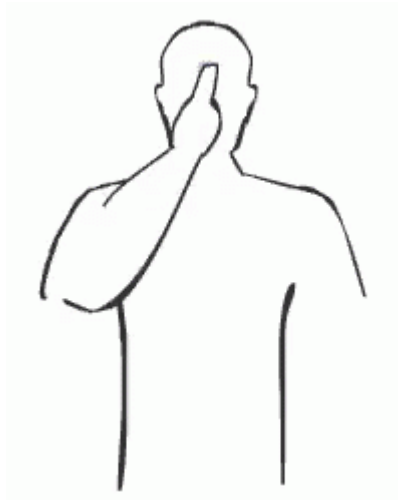
