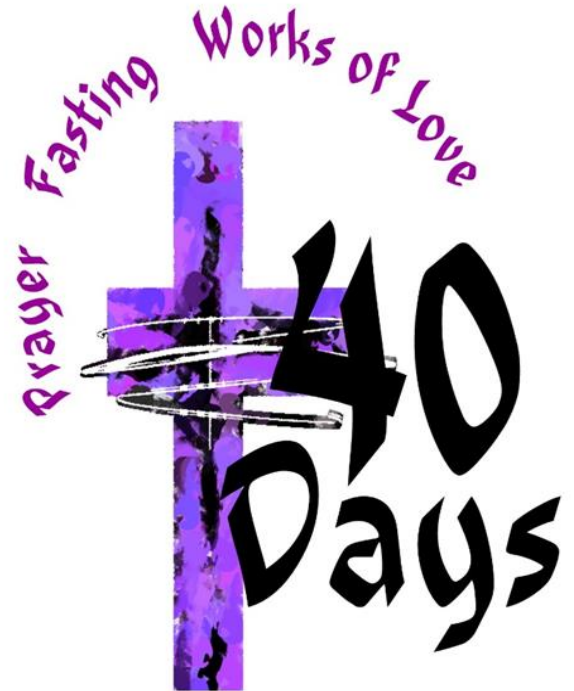

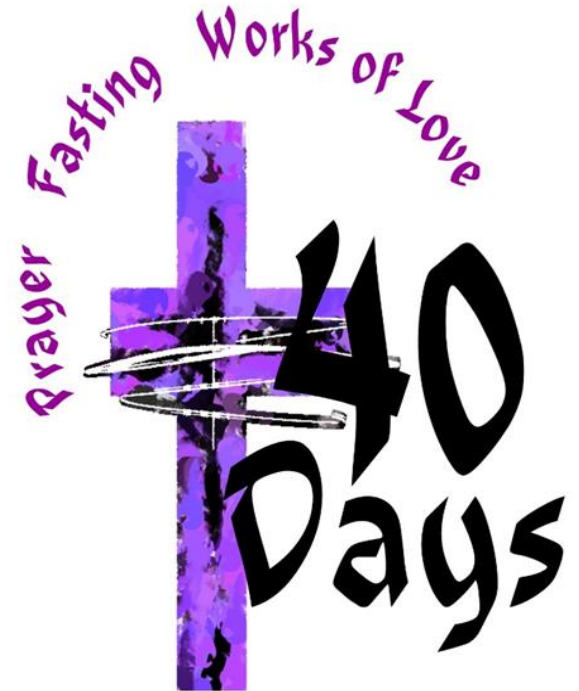

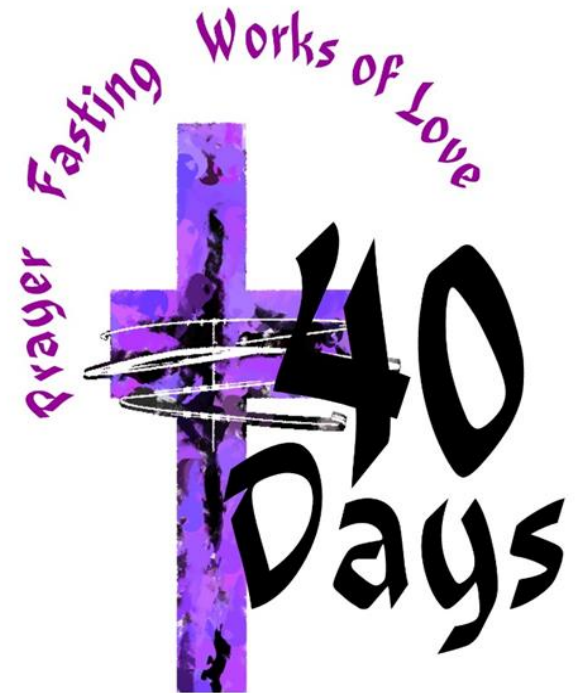


Jesus could hardly walk any further and fell a third time.

Did you turn to Jesus for help?





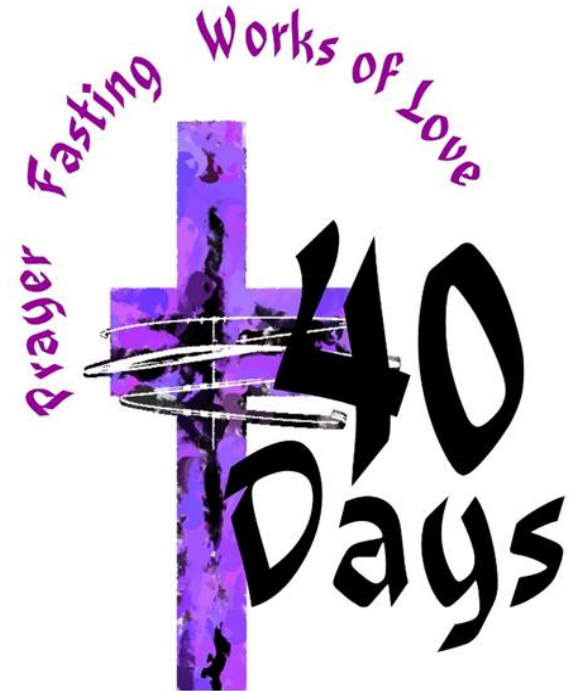

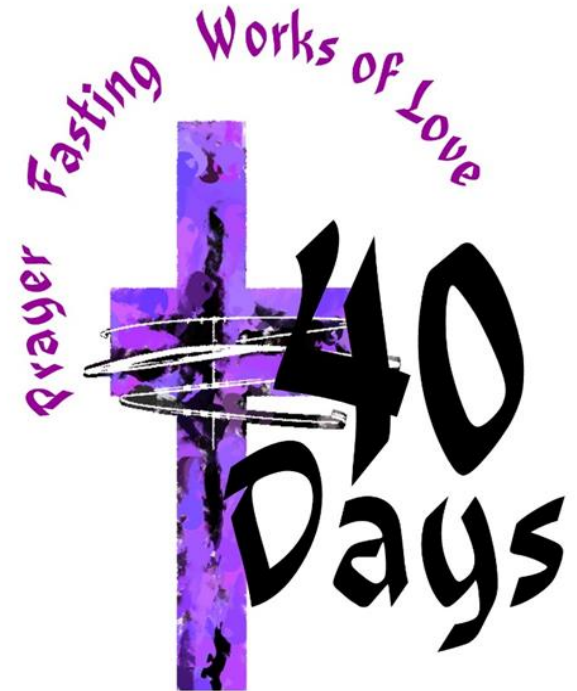

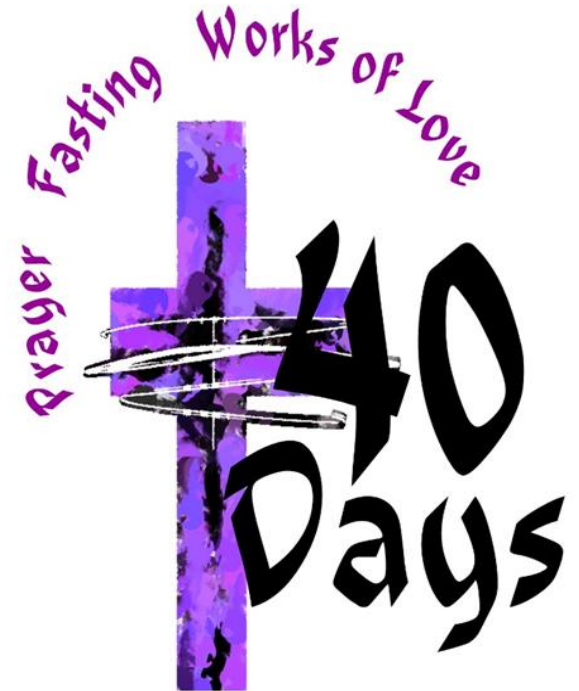


Adelaide House is fundraising for CAFOD:

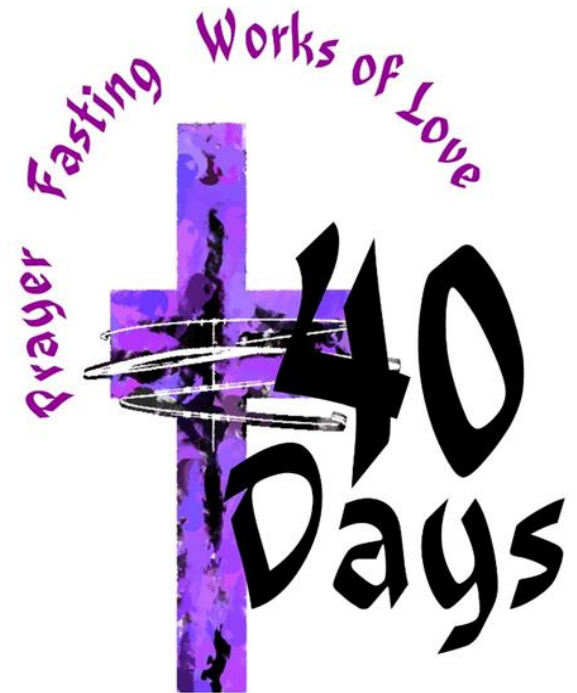

and where there is sadness, joy.

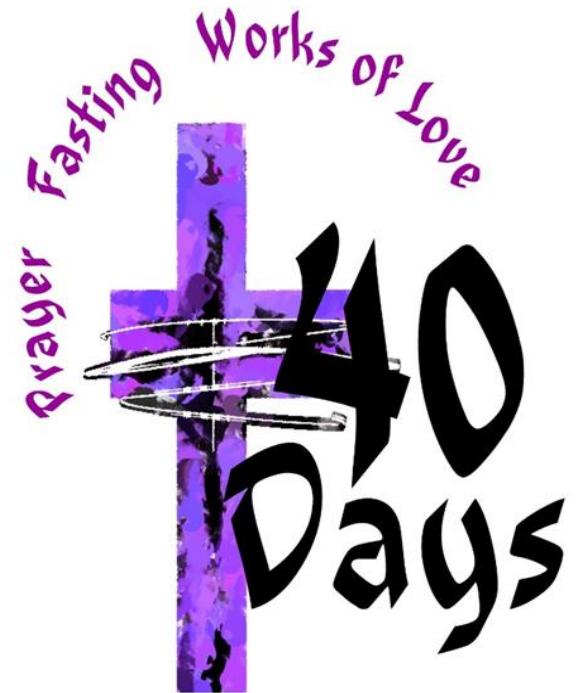

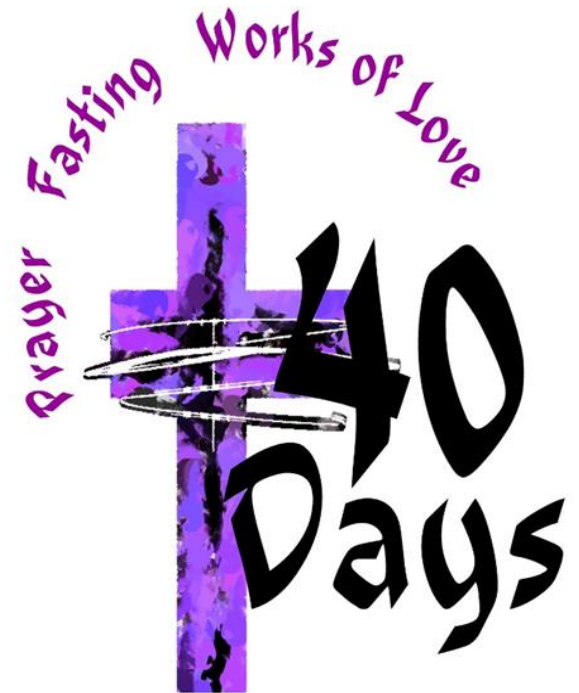
Word Wednesday 'Peace be with you'



Next week is Holy Week when we celebrate the Paschal Triduum or the Easter Triduum (from the Latin 'three).

It starts on Holy Thursday, continues on Good Friday, and ends with the Easter Vigil on Saturday night/Sunday morning.

It recounts the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the Lamb of God laid down his life for our sins.



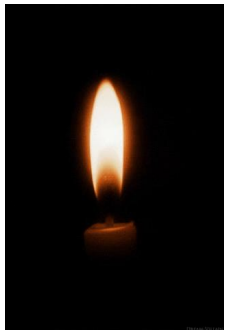

(3 crosses Forehead, Heart and Lips)

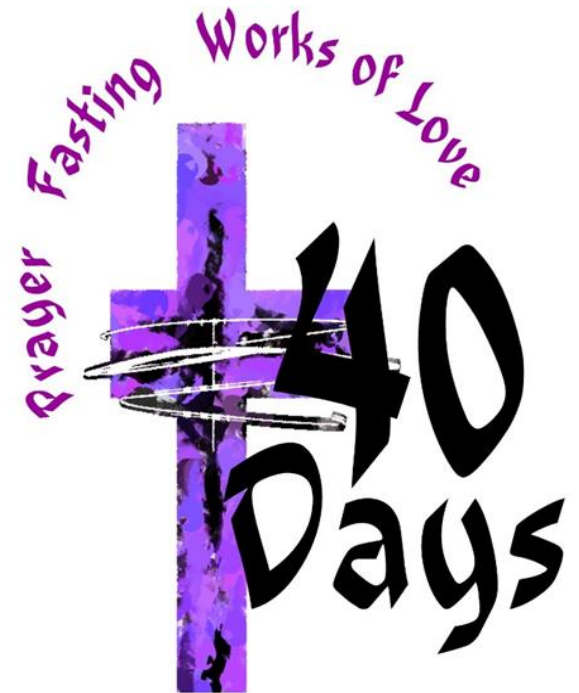




Word Wednesday 'Peace be with you'



As they went out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name. They compelled this man to carry his cross. And when they came to a place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull), they offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall, but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. And when they had crucified him, they divided his garments among them by casting lots. Then they sat down and kept watch over him there. And over his head they put the charge against him, which read, "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews."

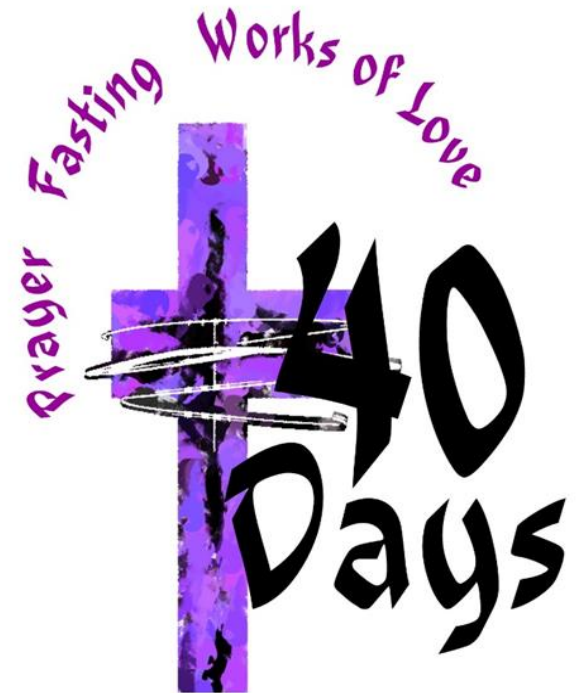




Word Wednesday 'Peace be with you'



Then two robbers were crucified with him, one on the right and one on the left. And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads and saying, “You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save yourself! If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross.”

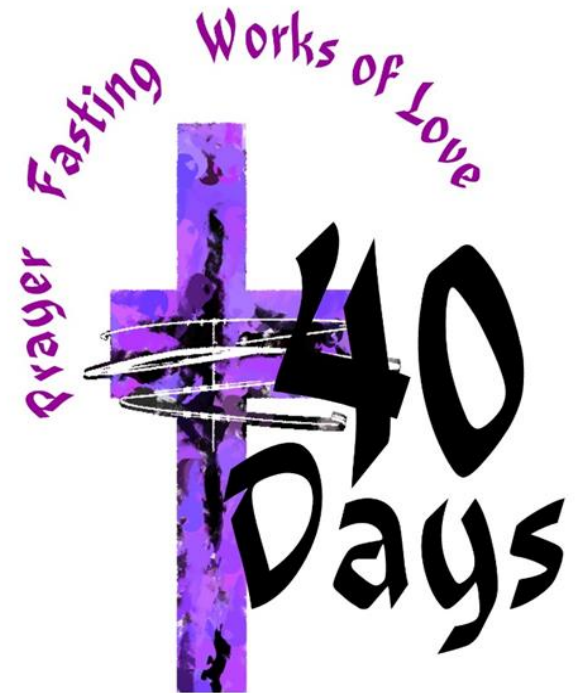

So also, the chief priests, with the scribes and elders, mocked him, saying, “He saved others; he cannot save himself. He is the King of Israel; let him come down now from the cross, and we will believe in him. He trusts in God; let God deliver him now, if he desires him. For he said, ‘I am the Son of God.’” And the robbers who were crucified with him also reviled him in the same way.



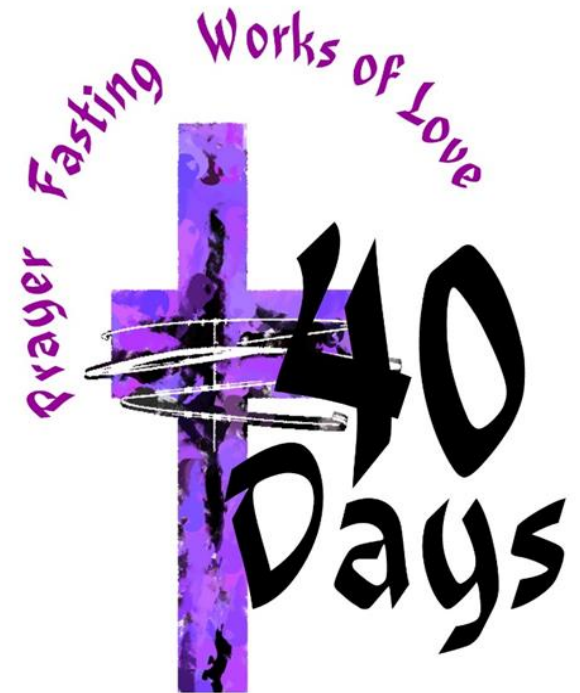

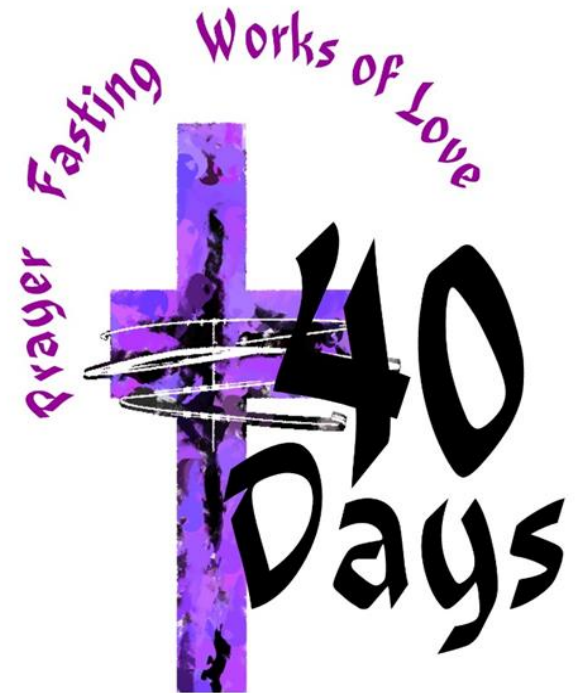


Word Wednesday 'Peace be with you'

- **The Invitation:** Unlike the criminals who mocked him, we are invited to ask, like the one who later believed, "Remember me".



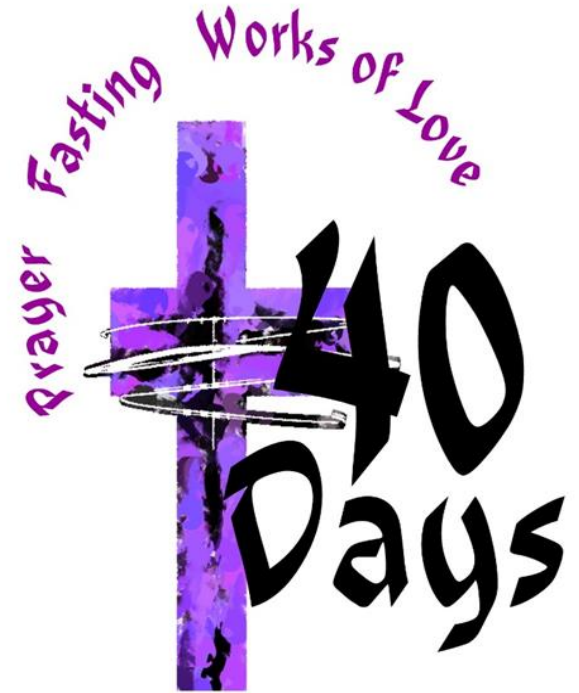


Word Wednesday 'Peace be with you'

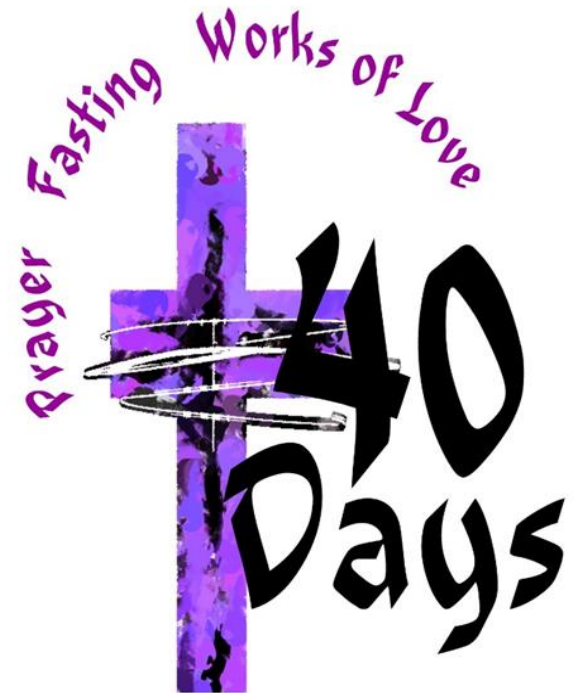
Thursday 'Peace be with you'

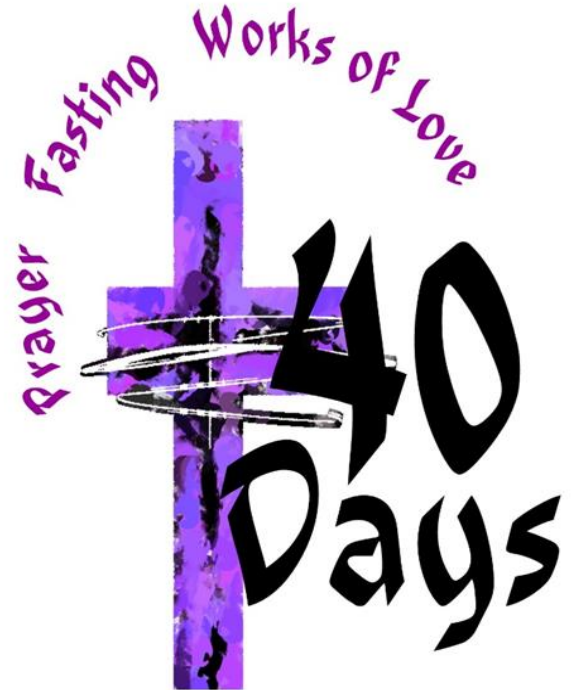

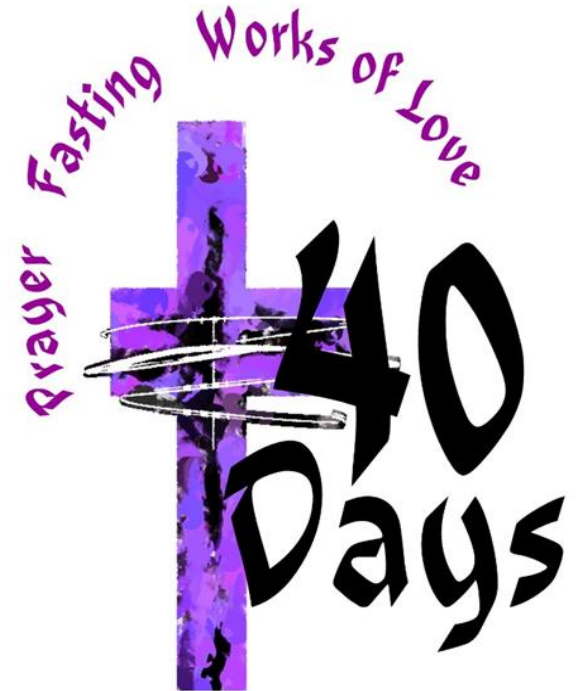


Tenth Station

you have redeemed the world.*





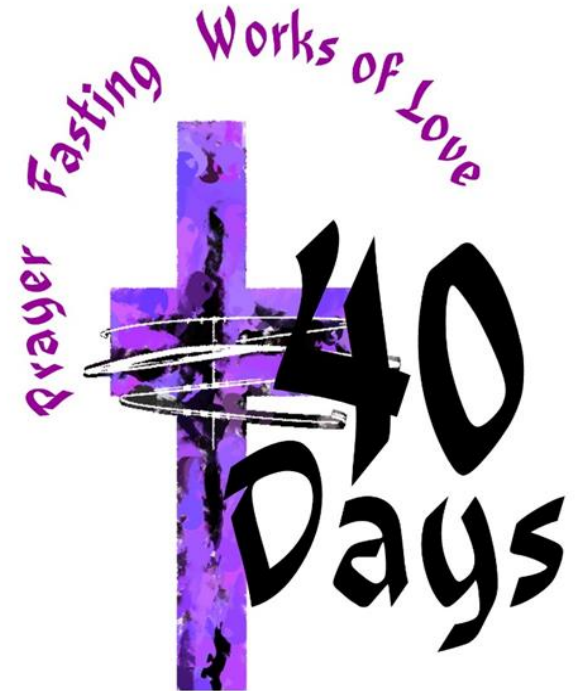
Friday 'Peace be with you'

Ask Jesus to strip away any unkindness we carry in our hearts.





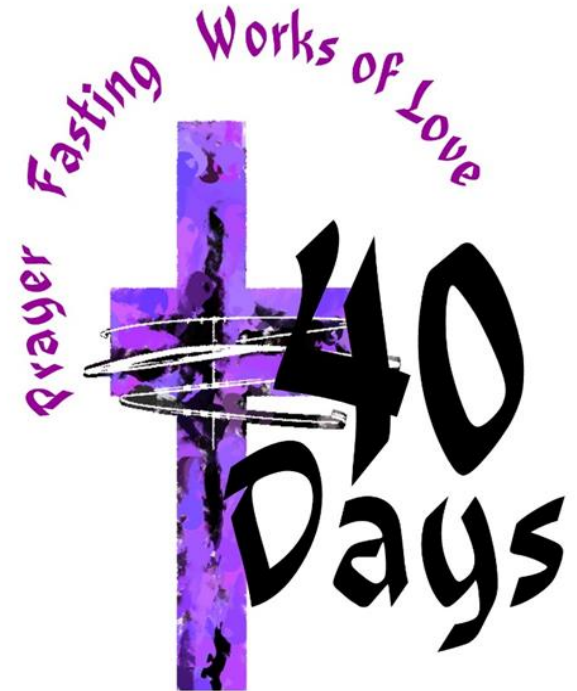
